I'm pleased to say that NIG have continued to offer the scheme to us this year and with no increase in premium, which is the third year running.

Renewals continue to be sent by email so please ensure you have received this and have dealt with it, please let myself or Saffron know if you have changed officers and have not received your insurance invite.

No days of grace are granted with insurance and it is vital that your insurance is renewed on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> December 2019, should you not renew on time, you will have to then arrange a new policy with Saffron and pay the full annual premium still.

I would ask you give insurance the attention it warranties and deal with it promptly, it should not be for Saffron Insurance to start phoning and emailing chasing you for payment.

## ASSOCIATION OF CARAVAN AND CAMPING EXEMPTED ORGANISATIONS

Notes Taken at the Open Forum following the 36<sup>th</sup>AGM held at the Ukrainian Youth Centre, Derbyshire on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2019 at 2:35pm

The ACCEO Chairman, Robin Wilkinson, welcomed everyone back after the break. He asked if anyone had any questions for their Committee on matters of a more general nature than were able to be raised during the more formal proceedings of the AGM or if they had any other points they wished to bring up in this forum.

Maureen Ward (Swift Owners Club) said the Motorhome and Caravan Club have 100 caravanning units at Grasmere for 4 weeks every year. As they are signed up to avoiding 'overuse' of any particular piece of land how do they manage this? Chatsworth also do a similar rally. Paul McArdle (Elddis Owners Club) added that a THS (Temporary Holiday Site) is run at Whitby on the same basis. Peter Brown (the Association Secretary) said the '28 day rule' was a gentleman's agreement between organizations who hold Para 4 Exemption Certificates and DEFRA, whereby these organizations agreed to exercise restraint to avoid overuse of any piece of land. However, the Camping and Caravanning Club say they have grandfather rights that pre-date this agreement and don't wish to surrender these rights. The question gets asked regularly.

<u>Iain Mellis (Alternative Retro Classic Caravan Society)</u> asked how much it cost to advertise in ACCEO Matters. Elaine Nicholls, speaking as ACCEO's Publications Officer, advised him of the rates. He then asked that if all Club Members became Personal Members of ACCEO, was the Club membership fee then waived? He was advised by Gaynor Hart (Membership Officer) that was the case.

<u>Paul McArdle (Elddis Owners Club)</u> asked if there was any advantage in going to the Caravan and Motorhome Club or the Camping and Caravanning Club, rather than to ACCEO, when applying to hold a rally in a National Park. Robin Wilkinson, speaking as ACCEO's National Parks Officer, thought not, and said you get a personal service from ACCEO as one of its Member Clubs.

<u>Phil Belt (Elddis Owners Club)</u> said he had applied to attend this meeting but hadn't received a reply. The Chairman said he would investigate and let him know the outcome.

<u>Iain Mellis (Alternative Retro Classic Caravan Society)</u> observed that there was no timing for the AGM shown on the rally poster. The Association Secretary said the poster was to advertise the National Rally, whilst the AGM details were on the Calling Notice sent out to every Member Club. Humph Jones (Minutes Secretary) added that details for this year's AGM were in last year's AGM Minutes which were published in AM Issue 98 (April 2019) and were also on the website.

There being no further questions, or points raised, the Chairman declared the Forum closed at 2:50pm.

#### Brexit - Driving Abroad and Green Cards

With negotiations continuing over the United Kingdom's exit of the European Union and uncertainty surrounding the terms of the Brexit deal, we want to provide an update on the potential impact should the UK leave the EU without a withdrawal agreement. It is important to note that nothing has been formally agreed at this point but we feel you should be aware of the potential implications on the motor insurance industry.

Guidance from the Association of British Insurers (ABI) and Motor Insurance Bureau (MIB) is that drivers taking their motor vehicles into an EU country should be prepared and have a Green Card when driving abroad.

#### Why is a Green Card needed?

A Green Card is an international certificate of insurance which guarantees that the motorist has the necessary third party insurance cover. These certificates prove that drivers are suitably insured to drive in these countries. A physical copy of a Green Card on green paper is needed when travelling as digital copies are not currently accepted. If you arrive at the border without a physical Green Card, you may not be allowed to drive in that country.

There is also the risk that if you cannot supply the adequate proof of cover, your vehicle could be impounded in the country.

#### **International Driving Permits**

If the UK leaves the EU without a deal, you might need an International Driving Permit (IDP) to drive in all EU and EEA countries, apart from Ireland.

You will need -

1926 permit to drive in Liechtenstein 1949 permit to drive in Spain, Iceland, Malta and Cyprus 1968 permit to drive in all other EU countries, plus Norway and Switzerland

You can get an IDP over the counter at the Post Office.

They cost £5.50 and you must be a GB or Northern Ireland resident, have a full UK driving licence and be 18 or over.

#### What does it mean to you?


At present the majority of policies arranged allow for policyholders to drive within the European Union for a certain amount of time with the cover being confirmed by the insurance certificate we issue. However you are best to contact your insurers to confirm before travelling abroad.

This year ACCEO was represented at the Motorhome and Caravan Autumn Parliamentary Reception by Gaynor Hart and myself. We were therefore so early that we went to the café to pass the time, so much time that Gaynor had to visit the Westminster Gift Shop. What with already having visited Harrods, Selfridges and most of Oxford Street, I thought she would have been all shopped out. But no, there were strange clinking sounds every time she placed her shopping bag down. Ten minutes prior to the reception starting, we met up with everyone in The Lobby; not even our Hosts were permitted into the Churchill room before 4 o'clock. It was a totally different atmosphere from last year with no MPs or television crews around. And there was, of course, no MP hosting the event because of the imminent general election. Fortunately, the Caravan and Motorhome Club had managed to get the Earl of Leicester to come along to present the awards.

Once everyone had gathered, Grenville Chamberlain OBE, brought the proceedings to order. In his opening speech he stated that both the big clubs and the Motorhome manufacturers had got together to oppose the new taxes imposed on new motorhomes. So on to the awards, presented by the Earl of Leicester. They were awarded to the best 5 CLs, the best Club Site, the best New Starter Site and last but not least the Site in Bloom award. The Earl then said a few words explaining how at his Holkham Hall farm they had adapted and opened to Caravan and Camping as another way to bring in the pennies. Also, that at his Visitor Centre they have built a new café, A Brew with a View responding to visitors requests. He has also joined the battle against plastic and does not sell bottled water; instead they have installed a filtered water fountain where visitors can refill their own non plastic cups and water bottles.

Following the awards, Gaynor and I went round talking to site owners, members and some of the Executive Committee present. One thing in common with most clubs today, on the rallying side, is that not enough young blood is coming through to take over the reins. Even the Caravan and Motorhome Club has seen many DA's closing down as no one is coming forward to run them; so we are not alone. All in all, it was another good event, albeit a much quieter affair. I must say a big thank you to Gaynor; because of her links stemming from with rallying with the Caravan and Motorhome Club centres, I was introduced to array of Club Members which gave me a greater insight to the Club.


